



## Know Your Rights

As an undocumented individual, you have certain rights under the U.S. Constitution, regardless of your immigration status. These include:

- ✓ **Right to Remain Silent:** You do not have to answer questions about your immigration status or place of birth.
- ✓ **Right to Refuse Entry:** If immigration officers (ICE) come to your home, you do not have to open the door unless they have a valid warrant signed by a judge. Make sure it's a judicial warrant and NOT an administrative warrant.
- ✓ **Right to an Attorney:** If detained, you have the right to speak with an attorney. The government does not have to provide one for free in immigration court, but nonprofits and legal aid organizations may offer assistance.
- ✓ **Right to Due Process:** You have the right to a fair hearing in immigration court.

### What to Do if ICE Approaches You:

- ✓ Stay calm and do not run.
- ✓ Ask if you are free to leave. If yes, walk away calmly.
- ✓ Do not sign any documents without consulting an attorney.
- ✓ Record details of the encounter (names, badge numbers, and what happened).
